RGYC has also conducted Sailing Academy programs like Tackers and Adult Learn to Sail. The Off the Beach program continues to thrive with a host of juniors sailing midweek and weekends under the supervision of Tony Bull and his team of volunteer coaches.

A select group of Junior and Youth Sailors qualified for the Barwon Sports Academy sports program which supports young athletes with access to specialist gym work and sports science. Many of the team competed at the Cadet World Championships in Italy. The Cadet team has worked really hard to build their skills to meet the challenges of sailing in unfamiliar waters. The young team was complimented on their approach to the competition and have done the Club proud.

#### SAFETY

The Club introduced the safety audit program last season which was met with mostly positive reviews. As more of the audits were completed, owners began to understand the value of reviewing their safety equipment and making sure all was in order. This coming year we are using the services of "Yacht Safe" an electronic service which is aimed at streamlining the declaration and audit process. RGYC continues to lead in yacht racing management.

#### **ORC (CLUB)**

The RGYC will be piloting a new yacht racing rating system ORC (Club) which will run alongside current handicap systems. This is a self measured fixed performance rating certificate. Dale Laurie has volunteered to help steer the new system.

#### **RGYC SAILING ACADEMY**

The Sailing Academy will continue to work on developing its junior and adult programs along with building relationships with schools and Deakin University. All the training courses are listed on the Club website, www.rgyc.com.au, under the "Learn to Sail" tab.
